
April 2024

Meeting was called to order by Charlie Meyer at 7:00 pm. Opening Devotion: Russ Rice led the devotional with a reading from "Experiencing God" followed by a prayer.

Approval of Minutes Russ Rice made a motion to approve the minutes as presented and Dan Miller seconded. Motion approved.

Correspondence: Received a Thank-You from Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, Luther Home of Mercy and the Fulton County Senior Center for our donations. A church use request was received from Lauren Rohrs to use the sanctuary on July 19 and 20, 2024 for her wedding rehearsal and ceremony.
