A big thanks to all who came out to help support our Soup Supper, basket raffle, and helped us celebrate Lutheran School Week. It was a fun week had by all. We hope you all enjoyed the lovely artwork hanging in the upstairs hallway.

Ms. Alli and the toddler class will begin by discussing plants. The toddlers will plant flowers and observe what happens and what is needed to help care for them. The class will learn the parts of a flower and the different colors and sizes of flowers. While the flowers are growing, the Toddlers will learn about Easter. Ms. Alli will then do Easter-themed crafts with the children and teach them about God.

In the 3 & 4 Extended Care class, Ms. Brooke and Ms. Colleen will teach the students about various bugs and insects. The class will explore the different types of bugs that inhabit the community and their roles. The students will then create fossil bugs using clay. Once the investigation of bugs is complete, the students will learn about Easter and its true meaning.

Ms. Tessa and Ms. Hannah, the Kindergarten Readiness class, will learn about Dr. Seuss and the letter Uu. The class will do different activities related to Dr. Seuss and read his most famous books. The class will learn about our four seasons and why the weather changes with those seasons. Ms. Tessa will have the kids make a snowstorm in a jar.

Ms. Hannah and the School Agers will learn about Easter and the significance of celebrating Christ's resurrection. The class will create crafts that reflect the true meaning of Easter, such as a handprint project titled "He is Risen" The School Agers will also explore the importance of recycling, understanding why we need to keep the Earth clean and what actions we can take in our community to support recycling.
