### **A Note on National Lutheran Aid Organization Claims**

Early in February there were accusations posted on the social media site “X” against Lutheran Social Services and Global Refuge (previously named “Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services”) made by members of our current United States administration. The accusations are that the funding these organizations receive from federal aid programs have made illegal payments, and that these aid organizations use the guise of the Lutheran church as fronts for money laundering. To be clear: these statements are false.

These organizations do tremendous work in their ministries and they are meticulous in their accounting transparency. These accusations are not meant to be taken lightly, so much so that the presiding bishop of the ELCA, Bishop Elizabeth Eaton, published a video on the ELCA YouTube page responding to these false accusations.

## We Believe

This year (2025) marks the 1700 year anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. This was the first of many very important meetings of the early church as they decided what it meant to confess the same faith and belief together. One of the outcomes of this council was the Nicene Creed. Though not used as often in worship, this creed is meant to help us confess the similarities of our faith together across any denominational divide. Our Lent series for this year will be called "We Believe..." and we will focus on the Nicene Creed and it's impact on our faith and our connection to the wider church.
