After noticing some significant symptoms of burnout, taking time for reflection, and discussing with the Parish Personnel/Mutual Ministry Committee and Church Council, I will be taking two weeks at the end of June and beginning of July for Spiritual Rest and Renewal. I am so grateful for the overwhelming support of our congregational leaders who care about making sure I can be the best pastor for Trinity as possible. From June 23-July 8, 2025, I will be taking an intentional time of Sabbath rest for spiritual renewal. Pastor Tim's Community Garden June 2025

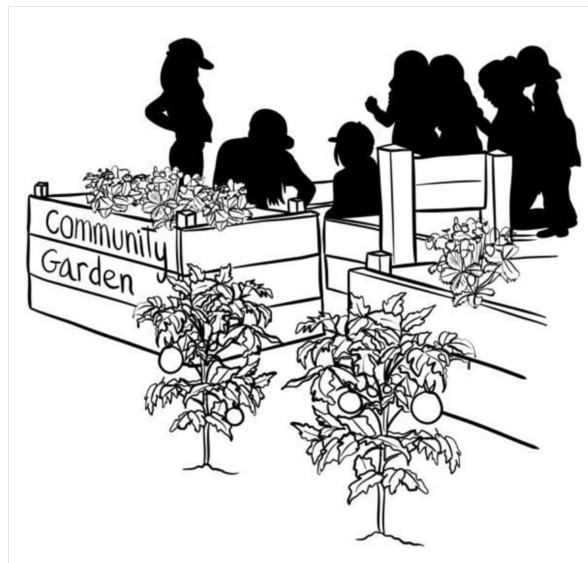
Located northwest of the church playground

The team working on the garden started planting early this year. Kim and Cindy Fry and Jeff Hench are the leaders of our garden and have been busy getting the seeds into the ground inside the planters. If you would like to help water, or help harvest or work with with the produce, let Cindy Fry or Aimee Hench, in the church office know. We can always use extra hands when garden-
ing.

When the produce is ready, they place it on our produce stand near our Leggett St. parking area. Cindy gets the word out when produce has been harvested so a few come right away when she posts the update. It is open to the community and last year a lot of community members stopped by.

So, stay tuned to Trinity's Facebook page for announcements from Cindy. Also know, that our church members can drop off their extra fruit and vegetables for others to enjoy. There is room for your donations on our produce stand this spring and summer.

On a special note, the metal monarch butterfly art sculpture has been moved to the garden for all to enjoy its beauty and for photo ops.





Miss Alli and the Toddler class will be learning about summer. The class will be introduced to summer safety. The toddlers will understand why we need to put sunscreen on to protect our skin from the sun, and they will learn why it gets hot in summer. The toddlers will also learn about camping. The class will make s'mores using the sun's rays to melt a marshmallow. Miss Alli will discuss camping safety with the class, and what it's like to go camping and have a picnic outside.

Miss Brooke and Miss Colleen will be building community in the 3-and 4-year-old classroom. This will allow the kids to get to know their friends during the first weeks of summer and understand how they can help each other in the classroom. Miss Brooke will be reviewing the classroom rules with the students, explaining what the routine will be like and outlining expectations for the children. The class will also learn about friendship within a community and how we can form good relationships with one another.

The Kindergarten Readiness class will also be fostering community within the classroom. Ms. Tessa and Ms. Hannah will teach the class how to create a community not only inside the classroom but also outside of it. Additionally, Ms. Tessa will review the rules, routines, and expectations from her class during the summertime.

Ms. Hannah and the School-age children will be learning about camping. The class will go over the rules and safety of camping but also what is needed to have a fun and safe camping trip. The school-agers will be making Elephant toothpaste for a fun activity.

Each class will also have certain days for water play here at the center and have fun times at the local parks for field trips.

Our Center's **End of Year Program** was **May 20th** in our **Sanctuary**. We had a great crowd of parents, grandparents and friends enjoying the children's program. The staff will miss the children moving on to kindergarten and they look forward to the new enrollees for 2025.

Our school-age summer session starts as soon as elementary school lets out.

Hopefully the group will be taking walking trips to the Wauseon pool on good weather days. Hands on science and interactive activities happen at the Center on the other days. Of course, all the children enrolled at our Center, ages 18 months through pre-k and school-age, have education and art classes every morning from 8:45-11:30 am.

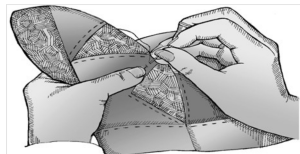

Recipe of the Month

RHUBARB CUSTARD BARS (Taste of Home)

Ingredients:

2 C all-purpose flour
¼ sugar
1 C cold butter

Filling:

2 C sugar
7 T all-purpose flour
1 C heavy whipping cream
3 large eggs, beaten
5 C finely chopped fresh or frozen rhubarb, thawed and drained

Topping:

6 ounces cream cheese, softened
½ C sugar
½ t vanilla extract
1 C heavy whipping cream, whipped

In a bowl, combine the flour and sugar, cut in butter until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Press into a greased 13 x 9" baking pan. Bake at 350o for 10 minutes.

Meanwhile, for filling, combine sugar and flour in a bowl. Whisk in cream and eggs. Stir in the rhubarb. Pour over crust. Bake until custard is set, 40-45 minutes. Cool.

For topping, beat cream cheese, sugar and vanilla until smooth; fold in whipped cream. Spread over top. Cover and chill. Cut into bars. Store in the refrigerator.

Opening Devotion: Reid Rice led a devotional based on Acts 9:1-19 followed by a prayer.
